Both Jay and Ken Hawk, President of the Freightliner Chassis Owners Club, have sent letters encouraging us to attend the Gillette Wyoming Area Rally June 30, July 1, 2, & 3. Remember this will not be an FMCA convention site for a while. Check the Club YAHOO Web site and the Poll in this newsletter. This sounds like a lot of fun and would come between the Pomona and Charlotte rallies.

Plans are being made for the Charlotte NC Pre-rally. For those of you signed up for the Pomona CA convention under General Admission who would like to go in and park with the Discovery International Group, you can still join us at Quartzsite AZ at Rice Ranch on March 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>, or at Pine Ranch RV Park in Banning, CA on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>.

By the time you get the next newsletter, you should have that Discovery shined up, checked out and headed down the road. Don't forget to join the difmca YAHOO Web site. 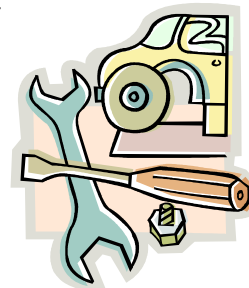

### **Cooks Corner** (Please send in some of your favorite recipes for sharing.)

#### **Pineapple Chicken Salad with Balsamic Vinaigrette**

- 4 cups fresh baby spinach leaves
- 1 can (8 oz) unsweetened pineapple chunks
- 2 cooked boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cubed
- 2 cups broccoli florets
- 1/2 cup thinly sliced red onion

For the dressing:

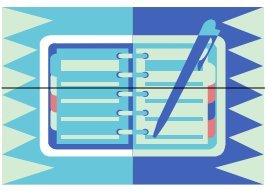
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 2 Tbsp. balsamic vinegar
- 2 tsp sugar
- 1/4 tsp cinnamon

Wash baby spinach leaves and pat dry. Drain the pineapple (reserve 2 Tbsp. juice). Combine the cooked chicken, broccoli, spinach and onions in a large serving bowl.

Prepare dressing. In a small bowl whisk together the oil, vinegar, reserved pineapple juice, sugar and cinnamon. Pour over the salad. Serve immediately.

#### **—-Privacy for Yahoo Groups and DIFMCA Web Site**

(from our Webmasters, Chuck and Donna Tolson)

If you belong to ANY Yahoo Groups (like our <http://groups.yahoo.com/group/difmca>), be aware that Yahoo is now using 'Web Beacons' to track every Yahoo Group user. They're similar to cookies, but allow Yahoo to record every Web site and every group you visit, even when you're not connected to Yahoo. Note that Yahoo's invasion of your privacy - and your ability to opt-out of it - is not user-specific. It is MACHINE specific. That means you will have to opt-out on every computer (and browser) you use. To opt-out of this, do the following:

\*Go to [www.yahoo.com](http://www.yahoo.com)

\*Scroll down to the bottom of the page and select "Privacy Policy"

\* Scroll down to the "Cookies" section; select "web beacons" link

\* Scroll down to the "Outside the Yahoo! Network" section; in the third bullet, click on the "click here" link to opt-out.

Also, Chuck is working on password protecting the member list on our [www.difmca.com](http://www.difmca.com) website so that no one will be able to use our members' email address to send spam to. When it is set up, members will need to request the user name and password from the webmasters.

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## **\_\_Convention News from FMCA**

FMCA's 77th International Convention in Perry, Georgia, will be the fifth convention at this wonderful facility. Following the opening of a new exhibit hall for FMCA's 73rd International Convention in 2005, the Georgia National Fairgrounds and Agricenter is making improvements to the parking areas that should be in place by the convention in 2007, developing asphalt roadways and better drainage.

FMCA's 78th International Convention will make a return visit to the Deschutes County Fair and Expo Center in Redmond, Oregon. The convention location was moved from Gillette, Wyoming, to Redmond, Oregon, for 2007 due to construction delays at the Cam-Plex, as well as sales issues in the state of

Wyoming. The Deschutes County Fair and Expo Center is also making improvements to their facility by adding WiFi capability and an additional structure that may be used for events.

FMCA's 79th International Convention will be held at the Fairplex in Pomona, California. The dates for this event have been moved to late February due to the early dates for Easter. FMCA's first convention at the Fairplex, in 1993, was held at the end of February with over 3000 families present.

FMCA's 80th International Convention will take place on the grounds of the Minnesota State Fair. The last FMCA international convention held at this facility was in 1980. Renovations to many of Minnesota State Fair ground's facilities have taken place within the past few years, providing some outstanding exhibit and seminar space. Como Park--home to the last free zoo in the United States, a conservatory gardens, Japanese Gardens, Cafesjian's Carousel, waterfalls, amusement rides, a picnic area, and even an 18-hole golf course--is located across the street from the fairgrounds.

We look forward to hearing more about their trip and having some photos to put in the next newsletter.

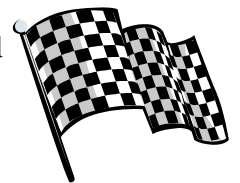
### POMONA CA

The 16th and 17th we will be at Pine Ranch RV Park in Banning, CA. We leave early on the 18th to be at the Pomona FairPlex by 10:30 to join the Freightliner Club and go in the fairgrounds with them. ### CHARLOTTE NC

Charlotte, North Carolina, *the Queen City*, will be the geographic location of the Discovery International pre-rally for the FMCA International Convention August 9, 10 and 11, 2006. Charlotte, with a population of 651,101, is the largest city in North Carolina and the 20th most populous city in the U.S. Charlotte is also one of the fastest growing cities in the nation as well as the second largest banking center, trailing only NYC.



Discovery International will be "rallying" just across the border at the KOA in Ft. Mill, South Carolina. 25 full hook-up (30 amp) sites have been reserved for three nights - August 9, 10, 11, 2006. John and Karen Didich have made arrangements for the group to take the "Feel The Thrill" tour of Lowe's Motor Speedway. Attendees will see the NEXTEL Cup garage, travel down pit road, ride around the 24-degree banking track and stop for photos at Victory Circle.

Final details - cost, included meals, reservation form, etc., will be published in the next issue of this newsletter. So, check your travel calendar and plan to attend.

## **OFFICIAL CHAPTER BUSINESS**

(As required by our Chapter Bylaws the following proposed amendment to the Chapter Bylaws is published in this issue of the newsletter in order to give at least 30 days notice to all members that a vote will be taken on the proposed amendment at the next meeting where a quorum is present.)

### **Voting by Electronic Means or by Mail-in Ballot**

There are times when events dictate that the chapter make decisions in a timely manner between the two routinely scheduled business meetings at the FMCA International Conventions. One example is the FMCA requirement that if neither the National Director nor the Alternate National Director will be able to attend the FMCA Governing Board meeting an alternate delegate must be elected by the chapter membership to be allowed attendance as a voting delegate. As now written, the Chapter Bylaws do not provide for such an election outside of the normal business meetings. The Executive Board may also identify other such unforeseen events requiring action before a business meeting can be held.

FMCA requirements demand that the Chapter have two business meetings each year at which a quorum is present. Typically these business meetings have been held at the FMCA International Conventions. Given the geographic dispersion of the membership, it is not always possible to have a quorum at these Conventions and there is no expectation that Chapter rallies with sufficient membership attendance will be held between Conventions.

The Executive Board recommends that the following changes to the Chapter Bylaws to provide for conducting an election or taking action on issues by either electronic means or by using a mail-in ballot. Also, the recommended changes will provide for “electronic meetings” to satisfy the requirement for two business meetings per year. The existing Bylaw section is cited and followed by the recommended change. The changed portion is underlined and highlighted.

(The Executive Board will develop specific procedures as Standing Rules for these alternative voting methods for approval by the members as provided in the Bylaws.)

#### ARTICLE IV – OFFICERS

C. At the discretion of the President, the officers may be called together, either in person or via electronic media, to act as an Executive Board, when essential action is necessary on behalf of the Chapter. Any action taken by this Executive Board shall be official only when a quorum of two-thirds (2/3) of the officers has been contacted and voted upon the essential action, and has passed the action by a majority vote. The action taken must conform to the FMCA Bylaws; Chapter members must be notified of the action in a timely manner, and the action must be ratified by the membership at the next legally called Chapter meeting.

#### **Change to read:**

C. At the discretion of the President, the officers may be called together, either in person or via electronic media, to act as an Executive Board, when essential action is necessary on behalf of the Chapter. Any action taken by this Executive Board shall be official only when a quorum of two-thirds (2/3) of the officers has been contacted and voted upon the essential action, and has passed the action by a majority vote. The action taken must conform to the FMCA Bylaws and Chapter members must be notified of the action in a timely manner. The action must be ratified by the membership at the next legally called Chapter meeting either held in person or via an electronic meeting.

Add new subparagraph D:

**D. The Executive Board, when called together, either in person or via electronic media, may at its discretion make a determination that the voting by members on a particular issue or election shall be done by electronic means or mail-in ballot. These voting methods will not be used in conjunction with voting held at a**

duly called business meeting. In addition, the Executive Board may call an “electronic meeting” in order to satisfy the FMCA requirement for two (2) business meetings per year at which a quorum is present.

ARTICLE VI – CHAPTER ADMINISTRATION

3. CHAPTER MEETINGS:

A. TYPES: The term “meeting” shall include coach rallies, campouts, dinner meetings, and any other gathering suitable to the function of the Chapter.

B. BUSINESS MEETINGS: The Chapter must hold at least two (2) business meetings each membership year at which a quorum is present. Said meetings must be at least fourteen (14) days apart and be duly announced in advance to the membership

D. QUORUM: A quorum for the transaction of business at any duly called Chapter meeting is twenty-five (25) percent of the Chapter family unit membership or 15 family unit members, whichever is less.

**Change to read:**

3. CHAPTER MEETINGS:

A. TYPES: The term “meeting” shall include coach rallies, campouts, dinner meetings, and any other gathering suitable to the function of the Chapter. An “electronic meeting” shall be held at the direction of the Executive Board. Procedures for conducting an electronic meeting shall be established by a Standing Rule developed by the Executive Board and approved by the members.

B. BUSINESS MEETINGS: The Chapter must hold at least two (2) business meetings each membership year at which a quorum is present. Said meetings must be at least fourteen (14) days apart and be duly announced in advance to the membership. If necessary an electronic meeting may be used to satisfy this requirement.

D. QUORUM: A quorum for the transaction of business at any duly called Chapter meeting is twenty-five (25) percent of the Chapter family unit membership or 15 family unit members, whichever is less. A quorum for voting by electronic means or by use of a mail-in ballot is the receipt of an electronic or mail-in ballot from 25 percent of the Chapter family unit membership or 15 family unit members, whichever is less. A quorum for an “electronic meeting” shall be attained with the electronic participation of twenty five percent of the Chapter family unit membership or 15 family unit members, whichever is less.

E. VOTING: Except as specified elsewhere in these Bylaws, a simple majority vote of members in good standing and voting shall be required to approve or disapprove any matter. This Chapter has established that voting will be one (1) vote per family unit.

**Change to read:**

E. VOTING: Except as specified elsewhere in these Bylaws, a simple majority vote of members in good standing and voting, either in person at a business meeting or by electronic means or mail-in ballot, shall be required to approve or disapprove any matter. This Chapter has established that voting will be one (1) vote per family unit.

**Add new subparagraph F:**

F. Procedures for voting by electronic means or mail-in ballot shall be established by a Standing Rule developed by the Executive Board and approved by the members.

Change existing paragraph “F. Parliamentary Process” to read G. Parliamentary Process”.

7. STANDING RULES: Standing rules are the written customs of the Chapter, and can be changed at any legally called Chapter meeting as they represent only ways of going about Chapter activities rather than adopted by-laws.

**Change to read:**

7. STANDING RULES: Standing rules are the written customs of the Chapter, and can be changed at any legally called Chapter meeting or by voting by electronic means or mail-in ballot as they represent only ways of going about Chapter activities rather than adopted bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII – AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

2. AMENDING PROCEDURE: These Bylaws may be amended by a two thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of the members present and voting at a duly-called meeting, provided that prior notice of at least thirty (30) days has been given of the proposition(s) to amend. Any member of the Chapter may propose amendments to the Bylaws. Approved amendments to these Bylaws become effective immediately upon their adoption, or at such time as specified in the amendment.

**Change to read:**

2. AMENDING PROCEDURE: These Bylaws may be amended by a two thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of the members present and voting at a duly-called meeting or by a two thirds (2/3) vote of those members who submit a vote by electronic means as a result of an electronic meeting or mail-in ballot, provided that prior notice of at least thirty (30) days has been given of the proposition(s) to amend. Any member of the Chapter may propose amendments to the Bylaws. Approved amendments to these Bylaws become effective immediately upon their adoption, or at such time as specified in the amendment.
